### Sermon Notes

#### Daniel 5 What Am I Doing Here? When the Writing's On the Wall . . .

What does the phrase: 'You have been weighed on the scales and found wanting' mean?

What does the phrase: 'The writing is on the wall' mean?

How are the two main characters in this story similar?

How are they totally different?

We say Jesus is 'the way.' The first Christians were called 'the way.' Why do you think this is so? What does this say about the choices we make when the writing is on the wall or we have been weighed on the scales and found wanting? Which 'way' do we choose to live and what does it matter?

### TODAY

**Today** - In Daniel 5 we meet two people who look the same, but couldn't be any more different. Daniel is one, but in this passage he is referred to by his Babylonian name: Belteshazzar. The other is the new king: Belshazzar. Both have similar sounding names, are in the royal court, understand positions of authority and both wind up facing an uncertain future. Who will be able to thrive when the writing's on the wall. Belshazzar tries his way and by nightfall he has lost it all. Belteshazzar humbles himself to God's way and Word. Could it be that in these uncertain days, when so much around us has been weighed on the scales and found wanting, that those who humble themselves and ' . . . honor the God who holds in his hand your life and all your ways' will be vindicated?
